Submissions may include previously unpublished articles, essays, observations, or comments concerning any aspect of the disciplines addressed by this journal. PJST especially welcomes articles from students and alumni of Akamai University. Communications to the Editorial Board or responses to published articles will also be considered for publication. Communications will be reviewed in the same manner as fully referenced article manuscripts submitted for publication.

Submission Review Process

Articles and communications considered for publication will be reviewed with respect to a standard set of guidelines for authors. Submissions will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

1. Scientific and/or technical merit
2. Relevance or interest to the Akamai University research community
3. Relevance or interest to the general scientific community
4. Readability and presentation quality

PJST employs a blinded process for the evaluation of articles selected for review. Each article or communication will be evaluated by members of the Editorial Board and/or the Peer Review Board. The Peer Review Board consists of volunteer topic experts from the adjunct faculty and from outside of Akamai University. Evaluations will be made on a 4-point scale with the following designation categories:

1. "Not Suitable for Publication in PJST"
2. "Major Corrections/Revisions Necessary"
3. "Minor Corrections or Revisions Necessary"
4. "Accepted for Publication as Submitted"

The overall evaluation of the submission shall be taken from the mean evaluation score of all Editorial Board and Peer Review Board assessments. Review guidelines are subject to change or revision with input from the editorial board of PJST.
